## MEXICO WINGSHOOTING SUGGESTED GEAR LIST

PROOF OF CITIZENSHIP

TWO (2) SHOTGUNS ARE ALLOWED ON YOUR PERMIT - CLEANING EQUIPMENT

YOU'RE ALLOWED FOUR (4) BOXES OF SHELLS PER GUN. I SUGGEST TAKING LEAD 6'S FOR DUCKS AND 2'S OR BB'S FOR GEESE. Shells are available in Mexico.

SHELL POUCH OR VEST, BRIMMED HAT, DUCK CALLS IF YOU USE THEM

WADERS (SUGGEST CHEST WADERS – not hip waders)

RAIN GEAR (TO MAKE SURE IT DOESN'T)

MOSQUITO REPELLENT & SUN SCREEN

COMFORTABLE WALKING BOOTS FOR QUAIL

BRUSH PANTS ARE SUGGESTED FOR QUAIL HUNTING - ORANGE HAT or VEST

CAMO FOR DUCKS/DOVES - WHITES ARE PROVIDED FOR GOOSE HUNTING

PERSONAL 'FIRST AID' KIT - COLD PILLS, ASPIRIN, IMODIUM, CHAPSTICK, ETC

CAMERA, FILM AND EXTRA BATTERIES

TIPPING: The suggested/customary tip for Doves Hunts is \$75/person/day. Since there's much more involved, the suggested tip for Waterfowl, Quail and combo hunts is \$100/person/day. *This tip covers the Entire Staff* – Guides, Drivers, Bird Boys, Scouts, Bartenders, Cooks, Maids, etc. Give it to your outfitter at the end of the trip.

BRING A COOLER IF YOU WANT TO BRING SOME GAME HOME

WEATHER: The area is very temperate and relatively dry. The average rainfall is 12". August and early September for Dove hunts is HOT – 80'S & 90'S. Typically in December and January the temperature in the morning is in the 50's and daytime temperatures are in the 70'S & 80's. If a front comes through it can be cold – freezing. Be ready for any kind of weather! There are rattlesnakes in the area, but most hunters don't encounter them. If you're nervous, bring snake chaps.
